## “Stormy, husky, brawling, City of Big Shoulders”

(Carl Sandburg, *Chicago*, 1916)

Welcome to MSS 2013! Welcome to Chicago! This city has left me awe-struck since my first, 1975 visit for the Midwest Meetings. I presented on a panel discussing Hugh Duncan’s (1965) *Culture and Democracy: The Struggle for Form in Society and Architecture in Chicago and the Middle West during the Life and Times of Louis H. Sullivan*. This sociological analysis taught us to value the American quintessence found in the culture, history and architecture of the city described by Carl Sandburg as “Stormy, husky, brawling, City of the Big Shoulders,” referring to the broad streets and tall skyscrapers. I still gawk upwards whenever in Chi-town.

Organizing these MSS Meetings from vision to reality has been a remarkable experience thanks to the contributions of 246 session organizers and 770 presenters. Together we have created a richly diverse conference reflecting the theme, “Integrating the Sociology Eclectic: Research, Teaching and Activism.” It will be difficult to choose from among 138 formal paper sessions, 32 panels, 21 workshops, 21 roundtables, three Author-Meets-Critics sessions, and three poster sessions.

Of special note are the two plenaries, two tours, and four social events:

- *Marx in Soho*, the play written by Howard Zinn, will be performed by Bob Weick of Iron Age Theater at 3:00 PM on Thursday. The Ice Cream Social follows the performance.
- MSS President Linda Lindsey will give her Presidential Address, “Sharp Right Turn: Globalization and Gender Equity,” at 4:30 PM on Friday before her Presidential Reception.
- Former MSS President Susan Stall has organized a coordinated panel and tour. The panel, “Jane Addams and Hull House Revisited,” is at 8:15–9:45 AM on Friday at the hotel. The 10:00 AM–12:45 PM tour visits the Hull House Museum on the site of Chicago’s first social settlement.
- Ray Hutchison will lead a Thursday morning tour of the neighborhoods immortalized by the Chicago School of Urban Sociology.
- The Welcoming T-shirt Happy Hour, Trivia Supper Buffet and Trivia Night Competition will be enjoyed Wednesday afternoon and evening.
- The MSS *Connections* Soup and Salad Buffet Luncheon on Thursday will give us more opportunity to greet old friends and meet new colleagues with similar interests.

Special thanks go to Lauren Tiffany, our indefatigable MSS Executive Director; Kimberly Maas, Student Director Extraordinaire; and our wonderful Local Arrangements Chair, David Boden. Their insightful overview combined with fine organizational skills and special attention to detail made MSS 2013 possible.
