I cannot give enough thanks to my student assistants, Pooya Naderi, and Carrie Wendel-Hummel, for their incredible effort over the past year. We launch our 75th celebration on Friday with a Birthday Party and Dance directly following **Peter Kivisto's Presidential Address: "We** *Really* **Are All Multiculturalists Now.**" I hope everyone will come to honor Peter and to commemorate the many years that the MSS has supported and maintained excellence in sociological teaching and research.

**"The Dynamics of Inequality," this year's theme**, will be explored in its many facets through a variety of formats over the next four days. Here are some of the highlights:

- Keynote speaker, Chloe Bird of the RAND Corporation, Santa Monica, will speak on "Constrained Choice: A Framework to Assess and Address Health Disparities." Chloe's talk elaborates an important dynamic of inequality in the context of health and health care. This is especially appropriate given the landmark health reform legislation passed by Congress in 2010.
- The Peter Hall Lecture this year focuses on Peter himself, speaking on his early "red diaper baby" years and connections to his subsequent career as an academic sociologist.
- Two additional thematic sessions feature invited speakers. First, Professor Alexander Smith of the UK (University of Huddersfield) will present a paper based on qualitative research conducted over the past several years in the Midwestern United States. In a paper framed by Pragmatism, he presents his ideas on political moderation. Discussants include Professors Robert Antonio and Kevin Leicht, as well as Boo Tyson, Executive Director of the MAIN-stream Coalition of Johnson County, Kansas. Second, Leonard Zeskind, McArthur Fellow and author of the recent book, *Blood and Politics: The History of the White Nationalist Move-ment from the Margins to the Mainstream* (Farrar, Straus and Giroux 2009), will present a workshop session on white nationalism.

**Members' books are featured at the 2011 meetings.** Several of these books will be featured in Author Meets Critics sessions. We also have many of our members' books included in our book exhibit. Then at noon on Saturday you will have a chance to Meet the Authors in the Book Exhibit space.

**Other special events** this year include a pub crawl to the historic Soulard district (Thursday PM), two day-time tours, and a Film Festival, which will run Thursday and Saturday evenings, featuring new and recent documentary films suitable for sociology classes. A venue dedicated specifically to students will be open adjacent to the Festival.


