We've got a great program on tap for MSS 2015. It features an incredibly diverse array of paper sessions, panels, workshops, roundtables, and poster events that covers the full range of subject matter in our field, an unprecedented number of thematic sessions, and a very special AKD teaching symposium running Thursday afternoon into Friday morning. In addition to all of the enriching professional sessions on research, teaching, and learning, the meetings will also feature the trademark MSS hospitality, congeniality, and good cheer. MSS Trivia night will be back by popular demand as part of the opening reception and festivities, and our Local Arrangements Chair Eve Blobaum has a great set of tours planned including one that should provide the opportunity for a taste or two of that famous KC BBQ.

The theme for this year's meetings is "Sociology and its Publics: The Next Generation." I have chosen this theme because I know that many of us MSS sociologists are inspired and driven by the call of public duty. In addition, I believe that the challenges of engagement raise deep and timeless questions about sociology itself: What is this discipline? Why and for whom do we do sociology? And how can we do it better? With the explosion of new media, increasing political attacks on the social sciences, and the ongoing transformations of higher education, these questions about sociological practice and its different publics have become more salient and significant than ever before—and we here in the Midwest can and should take the lead in asking and answering these questions for the field.

Some great plenary speakers are lined up to help inspire and guide our thinking about public engagement and sociology. Lisa Wade (Occidental College), founding editor of the wildly popular and awardwinning website "Sociological Images," will give one presentation on Thursday entitled "Doing Public Sociology: Notes from a Practitioner." Then, on Saturday Dalton Conley (New York University), author of *You May Ask Yourself, Being Black, Living in the Red*, and the newly released *Parentology*, will offer a second plenary on the topic: "Out of the (Ivory) Tower and Into the Fire: The Promise and Peril of Outward Facing Sociology." And almost every time slot on the program contains a thematic panel highlighting some aspect of the many relationships between sociology and engagement. This includes a session on the status on public spaces that features a return engagement by John Holmwood (University of Nottingham, UK), the Past President of the British Sociological Association, and a special Saturday plenary panel on the status of the social sciences in politics and public affairs that will be headlined by Professors Theda Skocpol (Harvard; creator and convener of the nationwide Scholars Strategy Network), Christopher Uggen (Minnesota; editor and co-publisher of The Society Pages.org), and our own Kevin Leicht (Iowa) who is currently serving a term with the National Science Foundation in Washington, DC. And don't forget Leicht's Presidential address on Friday night, "Getting Serious about Inequality!"

Thanks to the 2015 program committee, listed inside the front cover, my unbelievably hard-working and efficient student director, Erin Hoekstra, and MSS Executive Director Lauren Tiffany, our ever-present pillar of knowledge, organization, and resilience, for helping to pull this conference together. I sincerely hope that these meetings will help each and every one of you in attendance develop your professional identity and skills as well make a contribution to the rejuvenation and continued revitalization of our field and craft.

Oh, and one more thing: don't forget to look for your set of the sociology greeting cards that the crew at The Society Pages.org prepared for MSS 2015. 


