

WELCOME to Omaha and the 2006 Annual Meeting

Springtime greetings and welcome to the 67th annual meeting of the Midwest Sociological Society in Omaha, Nebraska. Given that it has been nearly three decades since the Society has held its meetings in this heartland city, we hope that you spend some time discovering its charms in the nearby "Old Market" district, between and betwixt the exciting and intellectually stimulating sessions that we have organized. As you peruse the program, you will see that we have a full spectrum of sessions, including regular, invited, roundtables, keynote, plenary, workshops, tours, musical, and other social events.

When we were brainstorming for the theme of this year's meeting, it was our intent to present an idea that would speak to the fullness of the sociological enterprise, something that would engage all members in terms of intellectual imagination, sociological scope, and applicability to any endeavor in which our membership engages. In selecting the "art of sociology" as our theme, we hoped to engage your creativity, focusing on the various ways that our discipline embraces the genres, tropes, methods, and ideas from our brethren in the arts and humanities. We wanted to see how social science can bridge the gap between us and other artistic forms of expression, while still being firmly lodged within scientific pursuits. We hope that you find our thematic sessions speaking to these concerns.

There are several highlights toward which we want to address your attention: (1) The opening keynote address Thursday afternoon by the esteemed scholar, Elijah Anderson (University of Pennsylvania), titled "Poor, Young, Black, and Male: A Case for National Action" will build on his award-winning books <u>Streetwise</u> and <u>Code the Street</u> to elucidate the situation that African-Americans face in our inner cities today. (2) Robert Benford's Presidential Address on Friday evening, "The College Sports Reform Movement: Reframing the Edutainment Industry," will speak to attempts made by professors and administrators at our leading institutions of higher education to change the culture of college athletics in the United States. As an outstanding scholar of social movements, Rob will bring theoretical perspectives to shed light on this group's efforts. (3) Saturday evening, David Snow (University of California, Irvine), who for personal reasons was not able to attend last year, will be here this year presenting the Peter M. Hall Lecture Series on the topic of "Framing Processes, Discursive Fields, and Politics." If you are familiar with Snow's landmark work on social movements scholarship, you know that we are in for a special treat.

In addition to these sessions, you will find informative and sociologically relevant tours of the city of Omaha, the Nebraska Correctional Facility, and the nearby Gallup University. There are also a dozen workshops, covering issues ranging from modes of teaching, writing and publishing, grantsmanship, methodology, and administrative and professional issues. Further, the MSS has come to be known for its collegiality and social events, and this year will be no different. There will be plenty of times for schmoozing, eating, drinking, and simply meeting old and new friends in a variety of settings and scenes.

MSS 2006 ANNUAL PROGRAM MSS/NCSA 2007 ANNUAL MEETING THEME STATEMENT: Social Policy, Social Ideology, and Social Change

In 2007 the Midwest Sociological Society and North Central Sociological Association launch a one-time innovation in bridging our two organizations. As the incoming President-Elect of MSS and the Vice President of NCSA (respectively), Helen Moore and Jay Weinstein will jointly chair our annual conference, to be held on April 4-7 at the Downtown Marriott in Chicago, Illinois. We are honored and delighted to work with our memberships to expand sociological dialogue with our colleagues and students. Both organizations bring a rich history of endeavors, reflecting the full range of methodological, theoretical and substantive approaches to sociological research, teaching, and outreach. Our goal is to continue those important traditions and to link these to the 2007 theme of Social Policy, Social Ideology, and Social Change.

Our strong disciplinary foundations derive from the classical scholars who sought to understand and influence social change. A common feature of early scholarship was the assumption that one ultimate purpose of the discipline was to improve the human condition via the creation of scientifically informed social policy. Support for this doctrine has varied over time, but currently, our professional culture is returning to a stronger policy orientation. The American Sociological Association emphasizes the importance of formulating social policy through Public Briefings and ASA Council Public Statements and Policy Statements (asanet.org). Both NCSA and MSS have hosted sessions framing social policy discussions with a sense of urgency that contemporary societies require sciencebased policies in an unprecedented way, perhaps for their very social survival.

If sociologically inspired and informed social policy is needed now as never before, it is equally true that sciences, in general, and social sciences in particular, confront a contemporary political climate of distrust. Sociologists working in policy arenas may promote progressive social change — now with encouragement from our professional organizations — and yet find themselves engaged in ideological debate. This "debate" process is familiar. Intellectuals and organizations that embrace forms of anti-science ideology discredit all forms of critical thinking about contemporary society and its institutions (typified by sociology) as "left-wing" rhetoric. Indeed, to defend their anti-scientific doctrines, some journalists, political leaders, and religious spokespersons have routinely characterized sociologists as "liberals" and/ or "Marxists." Their rhetoric conflates all forms of "ideology" with well-established and widely accepted tenets of sociology. This, in turn, politicizes debates and omits the role of social science investigation in resolving policy differences. One side is simply asserted to be "right" and the other to be "wrong" without reflection.

In selecting Social Policy, Social Ideology, and Social Change as the theme of this joint meeting of MSS and NCSA, we underscore the promise our discipline holds for informing policy that may, in turn, help shape a better social world. At the same time, we recognize the inhospitable ideological climate that policy science encounters today. The methodologies and theories we select for our current research. teaching activities and service outreach involve sociologists at both the margins and the heart of these larger policy debates. The very act of operationalizing research variables such as "race" or "ethnicity" links sociologists to political processes of gerrymandering and cultural processes of "othering." Research efforts to understand teenage sexuality or corporate crime can be thwarted by bureaucratic barriers. The policy rubrics from "No Child Left Behind" and "Workfare" also shape our communities, shape access to research funding priorities, and frame the questions posed by our students.

Today, as a discipline we engage with themes of social change ranging from the macro-sociology of global economics and social movements, to the day-to-day praxis of social action, interpersonal conflict, and family change. Our research methodologies, pedagogical strategies, and community praxis have fundamental and practical extensions to the realities of social policy and social change. Those scholars who commit their research to progressive social change move along similar disciplinary pathways as those who stand for dispassionate scientific methods. At every point along this continuum, sociologists are engaged with the social policy/social change dialectic.

It is important for us to reflect on our own status and impact as a discipline, as individual and collaborative researchers, as teachers, and as observers and as participants in the social changes that are occurring around us. The combined 2007 program in Chicago of the Midwest Sociological Society and the North Central Sociological Association provides multiple opportunities to expand these discussions.

We invite you to submit papers that enlarge and illuminate these debates within and about our discipline. All sociologists along the continuum of perspectives and methodologies we represent are welcome to participate in our deliberations on social policy, social ideology, and social change and the relationships among them.

Members of the North Central Association and Midwest Society and all interested individuals are invited to submit formal papers and informal discussion topics on sociological pedagogy, research and praxis. Bring your advances in quantitative analysis, innovations in ethnographic methods, and ways we can reach diverse audiences of policy makers or students more effectively. In the expansive traditions of the North Central and Midwest regional organizations, we welcome contributions across the array of disciplinary concerns. Please submit your papers or session ideas to Helen Moore (hmoore1@unl.edu) for the Midwest sessions.
