Welcome

by Susan Stall (President-Elect/Program Chair, Midwest Sociological Society)

Welcome to the 70th annual meeting of the Midwest Sociological Society. This year's conference theme, "Making Sociology More Public," is perhaps more relevant now than when I first selected it more than a year and a half ago. The stakes of the upcoming elections, the state of the economy, and the social and political issues surrounding immigration and globalization make C. Wright Mills' call for the "sociological imagination" more crucial than ever. Nearly 50 years ago, Mills charged us to distinguish "personal troubles" and "the public issues of social structure" in order to effectively frame public debate and social policy—a challenge that ignited the debate about the public role of sociology. If the fate of sociology depends on its connection to a vibrant civil society, how do we focus more on bringing "sociology to publics beyond the academy, promoting dialogue about issues that affect the fate of society...?" (Burawoy 2004:14).

We have assembled a diverse array of more than 240 regular sessions, invited panels, roundtables, plenaries, poster sessions, workshops, and tours, most of which speak directly or indirectly to the challenges and the potential we face as sociologists to make our sociological work matter in the broader arena.

We hope that these meetings prove to be thought-provoking, sparking questions concerning the extra-academic purposes of sociology. A few highlights of these 2008 meetings include:

- Thursday afternoon's Peter M. Hall Lecture Series featuring David L. Altheide, author of numerous books on the social construction and politics of fear, in his MSS talk, "Terrorism and Propaganda." How can a critical awareness of the role of news sources provide opportunities for social scientists to contribute to public education? Within the MSS program, other sessions, such as, "It Ain't Public if No One Knows About It," and "Using the Media to Take Sociology Public," examine sociology's portrayal in the popular media and how we can best get our research out to the public.
- The *Contexts* Town Hall Meeting on Thursday evening provides an opportunity to both hear from and speak to representatives of the new Midwestern Editorial Board of this ASA magazine. The Town Hall Meeting will be followed by an "Open Mic"—during the MSS Welcoming Reception—co-hosted by two rising stars: professor and singer Brett Stockdill, hailing from Northeastern Illinois University; and the MSS Minority Fellow, Mosi A. Ifatunji, spoken word host of *Mojo's Pen* at the University of Illinois at Chicago.
- Mario Luis Small, our first plenary speaker on Friday, speaks on "Public Sociology in the Age of Freakonomics: Bringing a Perspective Back In." Author of the award-winning book, *Villa Victoria: The Transformation of Social Capital in a Boston Barrio*, Dr. Small challenges the theory that poor urban neighborhoods are inevitably deprived of social capital.
- On Friday afternoon, Helen A. Moore, MSS President and winner of numerous awards, including the University of Nebraska Outstanding Teaching and Instructional

Creativity Award, gives her Presidential Address, “Splitting the Academy: Labor Market Theory and Praxis on Campus.” The Presidential Reception follows.

- A second plenary session, on Saturday, is a dynamic theatre performance by Chicago’s acclaimed About Face Youth Theatre Ensemble. Entitled “The Home Project,” the production is based on the true stories of the resilience of homeless queer youth, including college students, who have been kicked out or disowned because of their gender identities. Also, on Saturday, we will offer a staged reading and the premiere of “Six Sociologists in Search of Society: A Performance and Dialogue,” penned by one of our own MSS members.
- Myriad sessions directly address the conference theme. A few examples are: How can sociologists shape public policy and practices (Session 148)? How does one engage in participatory action research and what are the outcomes (Session 15)? Who are some public sociologists here in the Midwest (Session 87)? What do “applied sociologists” do (Session 175A)?
- Exciting and informative tours offer two opportunities to explore several of the neighborhood development efforts in East St. Louis and meet with local resident leaders. A third tour examines the old industrial St. Louis on the city’s North Side to learn about the work of the Old North St. Louis Restoration Group.
- In addition to the MSS receptions, social events include our ever-popular Ice Cream Social on Friday afternoon, and the “Pub Crawl” tour and Students’ Night Out—both on Saturday evening.

Some organizational hints: The material at the front of the program is a summation of our special events, committee meetings, and the overall session structure. The Program Summary will be useful in planning your daily schedule. It lists the day, time, and location of every session. We’ve provided a map of the hotel on the back cover. To find the names of program participants, consult the index at the back of the program. Preceding the index, you will find the names of the MSS’s elected officers and committee members, as well as some historical information about the MSS. In the middle of the program you will find complete session information for all 242 sessions.

This year’s program has benefited from the contributions of numerous talented volunteers. In addition to the officers of the Society, the members of the 2008 Program Committee, more than 200 session organizers, and hundreds of meeting participants, I would like to single out a few members who played extra-vital roles in organizing this meeting. I am most indebted to Oana Panaite, MSS Student Director for 2007–2008, who spent hours and weeks inputting conference data information into Excel™—“those tiny little cells.” Lauren Tiffany, the MSS Executive Director, worked closely with Oana and me on the complex tasks of scheduling, editing, and behind-the-scenes finagling needed to produce such a mega-effort. Helen Moore and Tanya Gladney generously shared invaluable information and offered support at exactly the right moments! Linda Lindsey managed the tasks of Local Arrangements Chair with enthusiasm, creativity, and fine attention to detail. Finally, thanks to my colleagues at North-eastern Illinois University for their unwavering supportive feedback.

Teaching Sociological Scholarship

Theme for the
Midwest Sociological Society Annual Meeting
April 2–5, 2009, Des Moines, Iowa

Public historian James Burke declares, “We are what we know and when what we know changes, we change.” In the past decade, what we know about teaching and learning has changed and so have we. Thanks to the knowledge produced through the scholarship of teaching and learning and by our collective experiences in the academy and applied settings, we understand better than ever how teaching practices result in effective learning. Thus, for the 2009 Annual Meetings, I challenge us to focus on the teaching of our research and our disciplinary skills to all our publics, including students. What are the intellectual and pragmatic issues for sharing what we know?

Three distinct features will shape the meetings in Des Moines. First, members are invited to engage in a greater level of explicit preparation for their meeting presentations. Can the quality across sessions be increased when colleagues intentionally apply their best classroom and presentation skills? And, how can we support that effort? Second, the scholarship of teaching and learning will be examined in thematic sessions on research agendas and application challenges. Third, the effective passing on of sociology will be modeled by invited speakers as well as integrated into several new formats: Author/Audience Dialogues, “Getting Up to Speed” Seminars, Practitioner Clinics, and plenaries that reflect our unique presence in the Midwest region. Such experimental venues will be designed to allow greater opportunity for the integration of knowledge and for professional development as scholarly teachers, researchers, and practitioners. As always, sessions will support our commitment to advance knowledge, prepare graduate students, and recognize the range of contributions by our members.

All sociologists and advocates for sociology share the challenge both of generating and understanding important ideas as well as sharing those ideas with audiences. I hope that particular attention to the teaching of sociological scholarship will help us to more effectively reach our publics. I think Durkheim was correct: “Pedagogy depends on sociology more than any other science.” Please join me in exploring if you think so, too.

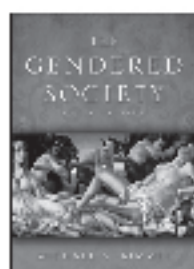

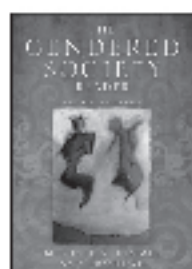

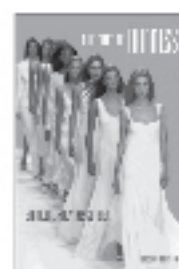
